

THE GOSPEL

Jesus also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted." Lk 18: 9-14



Message from the Bishop



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On this final Sunday of the Season of Pentecost, we are reminded of the essential role that prayer plays in our Christian journey. Just as oxygen sustains our physical life, prayer sustains our spiritual life. It is through prayer that we connect with our Creator, and it is through prayer that we open our hearts to the transforming power of the Holy Spirit.

This Sunday's Gospel tells the story of two individuals who approached God in prayer: a Pharisee and a tax collector. Their contrasting attitudes in prayer serve as a reminder of how we should approach our conversations with God.

Though the Pharisee stood to pray, his posture did not reflect the true essence of prayer. He did not raise his heart and mind to the Lord; instead, he lowered God to his level. He was, in a sense, praising himself while looking down upon others. This attitude reveals the mindset of those who believe they do not need God in their lives or underestimate the power of prayer.

On the other hand, we see the tax collector, who approached prayer with a completely different spirit. He humbled himself before God, acknowledging his unworthiness. He dared not even lift his eyes to the heavens, for he was acutely aware of his sins and shortcomings. His prayer was a plea for forgiveness and mercy. Here lies the heart of authentic prayer—a humble spirit that recognises our need for God's grace.

In this parable, Jesus teaches us that the Lord is not interested in our self-righteousness or the comparisons we make with others. Instead, He desires our hearts to be contrite, our spirits to be humble, and our prayers to be genuine. The tax collector's humility and sincere repentance touched the heart of God, and he left justified.

As we reflect on this passage, let us ask ourselves: How do we approach God in our prayers? Do we come before Him with humility, recognising our need for His mercy, or do we, like the Pharisee, pride ourselves on our righteousness and look down upon others?

"Hope does not disappoint"

What I'm about to say will only resonate with my generation who grew up listening to this song by an English rock band: "When I find myself in times of trouble, Mother Mary comes to me, speaking words of wisdom – let it be." These may only be words to a secular song, but they are actually sending out a message of truth, that our Blessed Mother watched over her children with a wisdom that we have yet to attain. Even amidst a secular world that doesn't know God, HE will turn all things unto good for those who love Him, as long as we continue to trust and hope in our loving and merciful Father. So, it's not impossible to "let it be" and let God continue to take control of situations that overwhelm us. Hope will never disappoint us. Hope was the source of courage that led people to Christ when they heard of his teachings and miracles. Hope is the reason for endurance in difficult moments, especially in the times when we cry out "Lord, have mercy on me, a poor sinner."

In our Church today, many people look for excuses to justify abandoning their Catholic Faith. I can understand how easy it is to wander from our commitments and daily devotions, when we allow 'life' to get in the way. I've learned that when I don't receive the Sacraments on a regular basis, my interior strength is depleted and it becomes a vicious cycle of less prayer followed by more indifference. Hoping in God's infinite mercy is my alarm bell that wakes me up each time I fall into that cycle of complacency, which we all tend to do at times.

The Sacrament of Confession leads me back on the path of holiness...a path that is scattered with thorns and roses combined...a path upon which Jesus and Mary will lead me as long as I'm willing to follow. This is the source of my Hope.

When I go to Confession, I am literally 'reborn in spirit' and the joy in my heart is impossible to hide, thanks be to God. The graces abound when we've been embraced by the mercy of God's forgiveness. The consummation of this great love between our human nature and the Divine is fulfilled in Holy Communion, and I cannot contain my joyful spirit after receiving Jesus in the Eucharist. Nothing compares.

God is so good to us poor sinners – uniting His Divinity with our humanity. We cannot hide from His loving embrace, chasing us like any good father would chase after his wayward child. How great is our God, who forgives AND forgets our transgressions, as soon as we humble ourselves in seeking the Sacraments of healing, asking for His Mercy that awaits us.







قال رب يسوع هذا المثل لأناس يتذمرون في أنفسهم أنهم أبرار ويتذمرون الآخرين: "رجلان صعدا إلى الهيكل ليصلبا، أحدهما فريسي والآخر عشار فوقف الفريسي يصلي في نفسه ويقول: اللهم، أشكرك لأنني لست كباقي الناس الطفائعين الظالمين الزناة، ولا كذلك العشار التي أصوم مرتين في الأسبوع، وأؤدي العشر عن كل ما أقتني. أما العشار موقف بعيد وهو لا يريد حتى أن يعرف عينيه إلى السماء، بل كان يفرج صدره قائلاً: اللهم، إضفْح عَيْ آتَى الْخَاطِئَ! أقول لكم إن هذا نزل إلى بيته مبرراً، أما ذاك فلا! لأن كل من يرفع نفسه يواضع، ومن يواضع نفسه يرفعه" لو ١٨:٩ - ١٤:١٨



زمن العنصرة

زمن العنصرة هو زمن الكنيسة، وينتهي مع هذا الأحد الذي يكشف آخر عنصر من حياة الكنيسة ورسالتها، وهو الصلاة. في مثل إنجيل الفريسي والعشار يؤكد رب يسوع أن أساس الصلاة التواضع، وأن مصدرها القلب، وأنها وقفة توبة واستغفار أمام الله.

المثل الذي أعطاه يسوع عن الرجال الذين دخل الهيكل للصلاה، يكشف حقيقة الفريسي، رجل الشريعة، المتدبر، العارف المتعمق في الكتب المقدسة، الذي لم تكون صلاته وقفه وجاذبية أمام قداسته الله. بل كانت وقفه أمام ذاته، وطلب بصلاته المتباهية شهادة الله له ومديحه على ما هو وعلى أصواته وإداء العرش، وأدان الناس الباقيين ووصفهم بأنهم طفّاعون، ظالمون وزناة، ومن بينهم العشار الذي كان يصلي في مؤخرة الهيكل.

أما العشار، فكان معتبراً في مجده أنه خاطئ، بسبب وظيفته ك管家 للمال التي كانت تقع في تجربة سلب بعض الأموال، وبسبب جبائة للمال للسلطة الرومانية الوضيعة. هذا العشار أقرّ بخطئه فوق بتواضع كلّي، "بعيداً في الهيكل من دون أن يرفع عينيه إلى السماء بل كان يفرج صدره ويقول: "اللهم، إغفر لي أنا الخاطئ".

في ختام هذا المثل، قيئ رب يسوع صلاة الرجلين فقال: "إن العشار نزل إلى بيته مبرراً، أما الفريسي فلا". وأعطى الأمثلة لنا جميعاً: كل من يرفع نفسه يواضع، ومن يواضع نفسه يرفعه" (لو ١٨:٩)

لقد شجب رب يسوع موقف الذين يعتقدون أنهم أبرار، ويحتقرن الآخرين. ويقول إنهم غير مقبولين لدى الله، الذي يعرف مكونات قلب الإنسان. إن الذين ولواطي رفعتهم الكنيسة قدسيين وطوباوبيين، كانوا يدعون
