When Jesus returned, the crowd welcomed him, for they were all waiting for him. And a man named Jairus, an official of the synagogue, came forward. He fell at the feet of Jesus and begged him to come to his house, because he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, and she was dying. As he went, the crowds almost crushed him. And a woman afflicted with haemorrhages for twelve years, who (had spent her whole livelihood on doctors and) was unable to be cured by anyone, came up behind him and touched the tassel on his cloak. Immediately her bleeding stopped. Jesus then asked, "Who touched me?" While all were denying it, Peter said, "Master, the crowds are pushing and pressing in upon you." But Jesus said, "Someone has touched me; for I know that power has gone out from me." When the woman realized that she had not escaped notice, she came forward trembling. Falling down before him, she explained in the presence of all the people why she had touched him and how she had been healed immediately. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you; go in peace." While he was still speaking, someone from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter is dead; do not trouble the teacher any longer." On hearing this, Jesus answered him, "Do not be afraid; just have faith and she will be saved." When he arrived at the house he allowed no one to enter with him except Peter and John and James, and the child's father and mother. All were weeping and mourning for her, when he said, "Do not weep any longer, for she is not dead, but sleeping." And they ridiculed him, because they knew that she was dead. But he took her by the hand and called to her, "Child, arise!" Her breath returned and she immediately arose. He then directed that she should be given something to eat. Her parents were astounded, and he instructed them to tell no one what had happened. Lk 8:40-56

## Message from the Bishop

The Maronite Church celebrates on 28 February the Feast of Saints Koura and Marana, the disciples of St

Maroun. Like their contemporaries in the early Maronite monastic tradition, these saints embraced a life of extraordinary austerity and devotion.

In his accounts of the two saints, Theodoret of Cyrrhus paints a vivid picture of their commitment to asceticism and contemplation, which went beyond the ordinary bounds of human endurance. Choosing a small, open-air enclosure outside town, Saints Koura and Marana lived a life of seclusion amidst the elements. Their dwelling, devoid of a roof, exposed them to nature yet, they found joy in their chosen path. Marvelling at their resilience, Theodoret notes that even the heavy chains they bore as a form of penance neither deterred their spirits. Fuelled by an all-transcending and intense love for the Divine, they saw every trial and hardship as an opportunity to draw closer to their beloved Bridegroom, Jesus Christ.

The lives of Saints Koura and Marana remind us that the essence of Christian discipleship lies in our capacity to love and be loved by God. It is this love that compels us to seek heaven, and to remain faithful to the teachings of Christ. In the end, it is through love that we find both the means and the end of our journey—a journey that leads us ever closer to the heart of Christ. Like them, we are called to embrace the path of self-denial and spiritual discipline always, not just during Lent, and not out of obligation, but rather a genuine desire to be united with the One whom we love above all else.

#### Sunday of the Haemorrhaging Woman

On this Sunday of Lent, the Maronite Church reflects on the Gospel of the Haemorrhaging Woman. Through this we see the transformative power of encountering Christ, who alone can free us from our afflictions and restore dignity. The action of the Samaritan woman underscores the ongoing process of conversion and renewal in our Christian life, fuelled by the desire for God who dwells within us.

During this Lent, let us emulate the example of the Samaritan woman who just like Saints Koura and Marana, show us that love is the essence and the driving force that propels Christian discipleship.

May we always embrace love as the foundation of our journey towards the heart of Christ. This love compels us to seek heavenly things, remain faithful to Christ's teachings, and practice self-denial and spiritual discipline. Through love, may we discover the purpose of our Christian journey but also the means to devotedly walk in the footsteps of Christ.

# The healing power of FAITH

In a world of diversity and secularism, it's easy to lose focus on what is most important in life. When we are troubled and struggling every day to find some peace or joy in our living, could it be that perhaps we are looking for the wrong things in the wrong places, trying to find that joy? For the haemorrhaging woman in today's Maronite Liturgy (Lk 8:40-56) her joy and peace was found in the faith which she placed in Christ Jesus. Can we say the same of ourselves today? In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, this account is interwoven with the account of raising the daughter of Jairus from the dead. Jairus, described as "a ruler of the synagogue", approached the Lord, then kneeling at the Lord's feet, asks Him to cure his twelve-year-old daughter who is dying – unbeknown to him that she was already dead.

An interesting point of comparison between the haemorrhaging woman and Jairus' daughter is that one had been sick for twelve years, and the other was born twelve years ago. The Lord raised a short life which had ended in death, just as He had raised the bleeding woman. In place of the woman's faith, the father's faith sufficed for the girl, when Jesus says to Jairus: "Only have faith and she will be saved." To the trembling woman who came up to the Lord, admitting that it was she who had touched Him, and was immediately healed, the Lord's response to her was a message for all: "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace!" Again, it is the element of faith that is essential when calling upon the Lord's intervention.

Jesus constantly reminds us that faith is the catalyst for miracles, even if our faith is only the size of a mustard seed. Yet, not all prayers for miracles are answered according to our wishes, despite having faith. This is not because God isn't listening, or rejecting our request, but rather, we must remember that God's ways are far better than our plans. He will never abandon us in our needs, but sometimes He will

allow us to continue carrying a certain cross in our own personal "Calvary" for a greater good. Saint Charbel, and many other saints, have been recorded as interceding for the faithful in miraculous ways, in accordance with the Will of God, but they are only intercessors and God is the miracle worker.

The Liturgy today should inspire our faith to grow, and our trust in the Lord to never weaken. In the "Year of Prayer" and especially throughout this Season of Lent, it is essential that we never cease to pray and to endure all trials for the greater glory of God and in reparation for sin. The healing power of faith springs forth from the well of supplication – through fervent prayer and hope. For those who are struggling to understand why God allows some to be healed while others continue to suffer, I can only encourage them to meditate upon the passion of our Blessed Mother, and not only the passion of Christ. The Blessed Mother's compassion with her Divine Son sets an example for all to suffer "in union with the merits of Christ" for the salvation of souls. Sometimes the healing power of faith is invisible because it is spiritual. As long as God sees all, we can have faith in His healing power revealed daily in the conversion of hearts. For this, we must never cease to pray.

ولد يوحنا في قرية سروم القريبة من

انطاكية. اسم ابيه اغاتون وأمه انوهاميا وكلاهما من المؤمنين الاتقياء. فربَّيا ولدهما يوحنا تربية مسيحية وثقفاه في مدارس انطاكية، ثم في القسطنطنية. ولمَّا توفي والده، عاد الى انطاكية. ثم مضى الى دير مار مارون على شاطئ العاصي ، ولبس ثوب الرهبانية ورقِّيَ الى درجة الكهنوت وسمي مارون نسبة الى الدير الذي ترهِّب فيه. وشرع يتفانى غيرة على خلاص النفوس ويحميها من البدع. ووضع كتابه في العقيدة الكاثوليكية الصحيحة، مبرهناً أن في المسيح طبيعتين ومشيئتين وفعلين كاملين.

ثم ان نائب البابا يوحنا الفلادلفي رسمه اسقفاً وأرسله الى جبل لبنان سنة ٦٧٦، حيث أقيم أسقفاً شرعياً على مدينة البترون وما يليها. وسنة ٦٨٥، اجتمع رؤساء جبل لبنان واختاروا يوحنا مارون بطريركاً انطاكياً.

وقد جاء في تقليد طائفتنا انَّ هذا البطريرك ذهب الى روما وان البابا سرجيوس رحَّب به ووشّحه بيده درع الرئاسة السامية. واتخذ الشعب الماروني هذا الاسم من ذلك الحين ودعوا " موارنة" نسبة الى دير مار مارون والى يوحنا مارون الذي جعل كرسيه الاول في دير سيدة يانوح بين بلدتي قرطبا والعاقورة. وقد يكون، كما جاء في التقليد، انه هو الذي اقام في كفرحي فوق البترون، ديراً يعرف الآن بدير مار يوحنا مارون واليه نقلت هامة القديس مارون ابي الطائفة. وعند تفشي داء الطاعون في البلاد، كان البطريرك يتفقد بذاته المطعونين ويشفيهم بصلاته. وحينئذ وضع نافور القداس المشهور باسمه.

جاهد هذا البطريرك القديس في سبيل شعبه واعتى بالمرضى والفقراء منهم وبنى لهم الكنائس والأديرة وأوصاهم بالثبات في إيمانهم الكاثوليكي، الى أن نقله الله الى الأخدار السماوية في ٢ شباط سنة ٧٠٧. صلاته معنا.

# "يكفي أن تؤمن"

للمرأة النازفة التي لمست طرف ثوب يسوع، يقينًا منها أنّها إذا فعلت تَشفى من نزيف دمها، وهكذا حصل، قال يسوع: "تشجّعي، يا ابنتي، إيمانك خلّصك، إذهبي بسلام" (لو ٨: ٨٤). هذا هو الإيمان الصامت المشتعل في قلبها. وليائيرس، رئيس المجمع، الذي تبلّغ، وهو في الطريق مع يسوع، أنّ إبنته ماتت، وليس من حاجة لإزعاج المعلّم، قال يسوع: "لا تخف، يكفي أن تؤمن، فتحيا ابنتك" (لو ٨: ٥٠). هذا هو الإيمان الذي "يرجو ضدّ كلّ رحاء" (روم ٤: ١٨).
