
#### Abstract

Then Jesus said, "There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So he divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be calted your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe - the best one - and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate. "Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.' Lk 15:11-32


## Message from the Bishop

Youhanna (John) Maroun was the first Maronite Patriarch of Antioch, elected in 685 to lead the people who came to be known as the Maronites and we celebrate his feast on the 2nd of March. Born into a noble family in 628 in Sirmaniyah (or Sarum), a village in modern-day Syria, he was initially known as John the Sarumite. His early education in Antioch and then in the Monastery of Saint Maroun equipped him with profound knowledge spanning sacred scripture, mathematics, sciences, philosophy, theology, and linguistics.

Entering monastic life and taking the name Youhanna Maroun, he was a gifted preacher, teacher, and writer. He taught and preached the Doctrine of the Council of Chalcedon, which proclaimed that in Christ there are two natures - human and divine. His style of teaching converted many to the Maronite faith. He authored the Eucharistic Prayer, which is still part of our Maronite Mass.

Amidst the tumultuous period marked by the vacancy of the Patriarchal See of Antioch from 609 to 683, the Maronites elected Youhanna Maroun as Patriarch in 685AD. He journeyed to Rome for papal approval, where he received confirmation from Pope Sergius, solidifying his position as "Patriarch of Antioch and all the East." With the Pallium bestowed upon him, Youhanna Maroun's authority became indisputable. Under his leadership, the Patriarchal See was
relocated to Lebanon, unifying the Maronites and safeguarding the unique liturgical and theological identity of the Maronite Church.

St. Youhanna Maroun's unwavering commitment and leadership serve as an inspiration to confront challenges with hope and steadfast faith. Today, we seek his intercession for our Maronite Church and its leaders, invoking his example and intercession to guide us toward salvation.

## Sunday of the Prodigal Son

The Gospel of the Prodigal Son which we read this Sunday invites us to reflect on the boundless love and mercy of God. In this parable, we see a son who leaves his father's house, squandering his inheritance in reckless living. Yet, when he comes to his senses and returns, expecting only to be treated as a servant, he is met with open arms and compassion from his father.

This story reminds us that no matter how far we may wander or how grievous our sins, God's love remains steadfast. Like the prodigal son, we may find ourselves in moments of brokenness and despair, feeling unworthy of forgiveness. However, God eagerly awaits our return, ready to embrace us with unconditional love.

During this Season of Lent, let us reflect on whether we strayed from God's path and sought happiness in worldly pursuits. Now is the time to come back to ourselves, acknowledge our mistakes, and turn back to the loving embrace of our heavenly Father.

## "Seeking out the losī"

As a teenager in the 1970's and growing up on the northern beaches of Sydney, my days were spent either in the local library studying, or swimming at Balmoral Beach. I was one of thousands who found solace in the sun and waves of our beautiful Pacific Ocean. It was during a holiday break that I met a group of 'hippies' who introduced me to their unusual beliefs and ideals. After encountering a few other groups of the age, such as 'the children of God' and 'Hare Krishna', it became clear to me that not everyone in the world believed in the same Triune God as Catholics believe. Often I wonder and ask myself "What if I went astray and followed one of these non-Christian groups? What if I were not born into a Catholic family?" This question haunts me every time I see an advertisement that seeks donations for children and families in third-world countries that are starving and homeless, on the brink of death. I wonder, with gratitude of course, why God chose to place me where I am. That could have been me...but it wasn't, by the grace of God. It begs the question though: is God's Mercy and Love exclusive to followers of Christ and those who are not wandering astray? Definitely not!

Seeking out and saving the lost, like the 'prodigal son' who appears to be enjoying his sinful ways, is as simple as showing mercy and compassion to those who cannot find purpose or direction in their lives, sometimes unaware that they are lost, thinking their way is the right way. This is what Jesus expects of those who follow Him: to imitate His Love and His Mercy when dealing with others, no matter where they've been or who you think they are; everyone deserves mercy, love, and forgiveness. When I was growing up in that "hippie era" God knew all I wanted was to find "the Truth" and He led me on that winding path of discovery which brought me back to Him. Thanks be to God, I am where I am today.

Imagine how all of heaven rejoices over one repentant sinner! We are all children of the One True God - no matter what or who we believe in. Let us remember this, next time we're tempted to question the worthiness of another soul, for God alone sees the heart and repays each accordingly. When we see others offending God by their actions, words, or lifestyle, let us pray for their conversion of heart, rather than condemn them. Jesus healed many souls with the words "your sins are forgiven" so let us pray that His Mercy will abound upon the poor souls who are living lives that are completely contrary to the Gospel of Life. We can offer our Lenten penances with this intention in mind, asking God to find a way into their hearts. "Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our hearts like unto Thine."
