THE GOSPEL

When Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them, not even in front of the door; and he was speaking the word to them. Then some people came, bringing to him a paralysed man, carried by four of them. And when they could not bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and after having dug through it, they let down the mat on which the paralytic lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, "Why does this fellow speak in this way? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" At once Jesus perceived in his spirit that they were discussing these questions among themselves; and he said to them, "Why do you raise such questions in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Stand up and take your mat and walk'? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"- he said to the paralytic - "I say to you, stand up, take your mat and go to your home." And he stood up, and immediately took the mat and went out before all of them; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!". Mk 2:1-12

Message from the Bishop




On the 9th of March, we honour the courage of the Forty Martyrs, the brave souls, once soldiers in a Roman legion under the leadership of Lysias the pagan, who chose to follow the path of Christ despite facing persecution and death.

Originally from Sebastia, Armenia, they refused to join the Roman army to offer sacrifices to pagan idols. Refusing to renounce their Christian beliefs, the Forty Martyrs stood firm in their conviction, even when confronted by Governor Agricola. Their refusal to participate in these rituals led to imprisonment and relentless attempts to sway them from their faith, including threats of stripping them of their military ranks. However, they remained resolute. The governor ordered them thrown into a lake with freezing water. They encouraged one another, saying, "We descend forty into the water; forty of us will ascend to heaven."

The Eastern Churches honour their memory and we strive to emulate their example of unwavering faith and sacrifice. We ask for their intercessions to face any challenges with unshakeable faith and glorify the Lord through our actions.

Sunday of the Paralytic

On this fifth Sunday of Lent, we reflect on a new kind of healing, unlike the other miraculous healings performed by Jesus: the Church bringing the suffering of one of its members to the Lord. The Gospel tells us that the man rose, picked up his mat at once, and went away in the sight of everyone. Strange is the case of this

healed man: his only action was to carry out Jesus' command, to pick up his mat and go home. He was silent, speaking only through his compliance with the Lord's will: the Lord healed him, so he thanked Him by standing before the community, carrying his mat after years of being carried on it.

Thus, the focus of this healing was not solely on the faith of the healed man but also on the community around him. The narrative begins with the community bringing the paralysed man to Jesus but ends with the the healed man bringing faith to the community who were "astounded and glorified God."

Just as the four friends carried the paralysed man to the Lord, the Church also carries us towards healing. These arms lifting us are the prayers of the saints, the prayers of the church in heaven, our prayers for one another and our own personal prayers. Our faith is not meant to be lived alone but in a community where we support one another: family, friends, colleagues, carrying one another to Christ with humility.

This week, we ask our Heavenly Father to teach us how to unite our families and communities and care for them with love. May we encourage and support one another in our faith so that anybody who looks at our church community is astounded and glorifies God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this." (Mark 2:12)

"Your sins are forgiven"


These are the most beautiful words that any soul could ever hear, especially a soul that has been stained with the torments of a sinful life. The Word of God gives us a strong reminder of the healing power of forgiveness and compassion. The woman who poured her tears and fragrant oils upon the feet of Jesus was a prime example of the great mercy of God toward the contrite of heart. Jesus wanted to express His love for this repentant sinner through the power of forgiveness, through the Sacrament of Deliverance and Healing.

In these days when every kind of convenience is found at our fingertips, and when social media has taken the place of personal encounters and dialogue, even the family structure would appear to have lost much more than it has gained. Instead of calling one another occasionally to say "Hi, how are you today" we tend to use text messages or social media platforms, hiding our faces and our emotions from one another. Smiles become nothing more than emoticons on the phone, and we forget what it means "to see someone's heart through the window of their eyes." What kind of a society have we become, when hugs and kisses are replaced with "X" and "O"?

Our Lord wants to tell us something very important today; a message especially for all families to ponder upon. A message of caring and compassion. Do we talk to each other at home with love and respect? Do we make time to share our day's events with one another? Do we smile and show affection to our siblings, parents, spouses or children? Have we forgotten what it's like to play games together, or to just share stories and laughter while sitting around the kitchen table? These are simple, yet essential questions to ask ourselves in all honesty.

Jesus was bold and clear when He reminded all present that those who have been forgiven the most, are the ones who will love the most. It is very important to show our love for God by loving our neighbour, as this is the greatest commandment given to us. At home, our neighbour is there living with us in the family. Mutual respect and love must be exemplified through words and actions. Children will learn from what they see before them. Let us strive to put more effort into all that we do each day in our journey as one family toward our Heavenly Home. Let us not forget the healing power of forgiveness, and never be too proud to say "I'm sorry, please forgive me" or too proud to say, "I forgive you." In a loving family, there is no room for pride, no room for isolation, no room for neglect. God is Love, and love has been freely given to us. Let us love as God has loved us and continues to love us. We are all sinners before God, but in His infinite mercy He doesn't look upon our sins but sees our hearts and our intentions, awaiting our contrite repentance through the holy Sacrament of Confession. Be not afraid to seek forgiveness - the more you are forgiven, the more you love.

However the need is great so let us continue working together to help those in our homeland who need it most.







أو التكرار مع الأسف، من دون أن ندرك أنها هي رحمة الله بحد ذاتها، لأنها تحكي عن حنان الآب وبها نعيش رحمته. متى ندرك أنه عندما نفتح أيدينا لنصليها فإننا نعبّر عن قبولنا بأن نُصلب وبأن تُدق مسامير في أيدينا، مثل يسوع؟

في كلمة "أبانا" يعلّمنا الرب أن هذه الصلاة جماعية. واحد للكل والكل لواحد. في ذلك اتحاد الجماعة وقوتها. **عندما أقول "أبانا" أخرج من أنانيتي ويذكّرني الله بأني ابنه.** وكأن الرب يسوع أراد أن يقول لكل شخص منا، ومن الكلمة الأولى في هذه الصلاة: انتبه أيها الإنسان واعرف قيمتك، الله أبوك، خلقك على صورته ومثاله. كلمة "أبانا" تجعلي أعيد حساباتي، لأن صيت أبي السماوي على المحك. فيها شراكة مع الله. يسمح لى بأن أناديه أبي. بها أتحد مع يسوع والله لنصبح واحداً.

في عبارة "الذي في السموات" إعتراف بعظمة الله اللامتناهية. ليس المطلوب مني أن أفهم سّره بل أن أدخل معه، على رغم محدوديتي وضعفي، بمشروع الشراكة. نحن أمام مجد وعظمة لا حدود لهما. بنوّتنا له تجعل منزلنا في السماء. لطالما أمضينا وقتاً طويلاً في البحث عن قطعة أرض أو بيت في هذه الدنيا! هل حاولنا مرة البحث عن منزل لنا في السماء؟ "ليتقدّس اسمك" يعني ليتمجّد اسم الله من خلال شعبه وقدّيسيه، ومن خلال كل شخص منا. عليّ أنا أيضاً أن أقدّس اسمه في كل شيء. وعندما أقدّس اسمه لا أستطيع المساومة على تعاليم الكنيسة أو قدسيتها، فهي عروس الابن. إن الله القدوس ليس بحاجة إليّ، لكنه يمنحني من خلال تقديسي اسمه فرصة مشاركته القداسة.

"ليأتِ ملكوتك" هي جوهر الأبانا. إنها قدس أقداس الرب. كل هدف المسيحي هو الدخول إلى الملكوت. آتي بالله إلى الأرض لكي أذهب معه إلى السماء حيث مملكته. أدخل الملكوت عندما أعيش العدل والفرح والسلام. ومن خلال الأفخارستيا

يصبح مفتاح الملكوت في يدي لأن القربانة هي الملكوت بحد ذاته.

"لتكن مشيئتك، كما في السماء كذلك على الأرض"، هي دعوة لمساعدة الله على تتميم مشيئته لا مشيئتنا نحن. عندما أتمّم مشيئته أكون شريكاً له عن حق. لقد وقّع الله معي صك الشراكة. حبرُ توقيعه دمُ ابنه. بأيّ حبر أوقّع أنا؟.

لماذا كان الصّليب ضرورياً؟


لماذا كان الصّليب ضروريًّا؟ بسبب جسامة الشرّ الذي كان يستعبدُنا. فصليب يسوع يُعلن عن أُمرَين في آن معًا: عن كلِّ قوَّة الشرّ السلبيَّة، وعن كلِّ قدرة رحَّمةً الله العذبة. وقد بدا الصّليب وكأنّه فشل يسوع، ولكنَّه في الواقع هو رمز انتصاره. في الجلجلة، كان الذين يستهزئون به يقولون له: "إنْ كنتَ ابن الله فانزل عن الصّليب!" (متّى ٢٧/ ٤). لكنَّ الحقيقة كانت في النّقيض: لأنَّ يسوع هو حقيقة ابن الله. بقى هناك، معلَّقًا على الصّليب، أَمينًا حتّى النهاية لتدبير محبَّة الآب. ولهذا السَّبب بالذات "رفع" الله يسوع (فل ٢ / ٩)، مانحًا إيّاه مُلكًا شاملاً. قد يسألُنا شخص غير مسيحيّ: لماذا الاحتفال بارتفاع الصّليب؟ يُمكننا الردّ بأنّنا لا نُحتفل بارتفاع صليب ما، أو بجميع الصّلبان: نحن نحتفل بارتفاع صليب يسوع، فمن خلالُه تجلَّت محبَّة الله القصوى للبشريَّة. وهذا ما يذكِّرْنا به إنجيل يوحنَّا: "لأنَّه هكذا أَحتَّ الله العالم حتّى بذل ابنه الوحيد" (يو ٣/ ١٦). فالله الآب قد "وهبنا" ابنه ليُخلِّصنا، وهذا ما اقتضى موت يسوع، موته على الصّليب. البابا فرنسيس

"ولمّا رأى يسوع إيمانهم"

لـمّا سمع الرجال الأربعة كلمة الله من فم يسوع فى بلدتهم كفرناحوم، والجمع غفير، آمنوا بيسوع وأتوه بمخلّع، إيمانًا منهم أنّه قادر على شفائه. وللدلالة على هذا الإيمان، "نبشوا السقف **ودلّوا السرير الذي كان المخلّع مطروحًا عليه**، لأنهم لم يستطيعوا الدخول من الباب، فما كان من يسوع إلَّا أن شفاه نفسًا وجسدًا، قائلًا له: "**يا ابني، مغفورةٌ لك خطاياك**"(مر ٢: ٥)، ثمّ **"قم احمل** سريرك واذهب إلى بيتك" (مر ٢: ١١). وهكذا ظهر يسوع "طبيب الأرواح والأجساد".
