

THE GOSPEI

Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. And he said to them, "What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?" They stood still, looking sad. Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?" He asked them, "What things?" They replied, "The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him." Then he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the Scriptures. As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the Scriptures to us?" That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread. Lk 24: 13-35

Message from the Bishop

This Sunday, we reflect on the Gospel of the

Road to Emmaus, where we meet the Resurrected Christ Himself, accompanying two disciples on their journey. The disciples had indeed heard, just like the apostles, about the empty tomb. Despite being well-prepared by Christ Himself, this knowledge alone did not suffice to convince them that what Jesus had predicted had truly come to pass. For them, the story was over. They returned home saddened and disappointed.

What was missing for them to move from observing the empty tomb to faith? The Gospel of Saint Luke shows us that it is the Risen Christ Himself who enables the disciples to interpret the events. Jesus is the teacher of faith. The

Gospel reveals three decisive aspects of the experience that will lead them to recognise His Resurrection.

The first of these elements lies in the mysterious presence of Christ by their side on the road. Jesus gives them understanding of the Scriptures and enables them to reinterpret the events in Jerusalem in light of what had been foretold since Moses and the prophets, thus helping them understand.

The second moment of this journey into faith is the shared meal with Christ in Emmaus. The meal is the place of recognising the Risen Christ in several Gospel accounts. Just as the Lord did at the Last Supper: "He took the bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them" (Luke 24:30). Their eyes are opened, and they recognise Him. This means that if we want to know the Risen Christ, we cannot do without the celebration of the Eucharist. Without it, we

The third aspect of recognising and understanding the Resurrection comes through the testimony of the apostles. The disciples rushed back to Jerusalem to share their extraordinary encounter with Christ. Surprisingly, it's the apostles who confirm Christ's Resurrection to them. Their testimony authenticates the disciples' experience. Thus, the testimony of Christ's Resurrection comes from those whom Jesus Himself instituted to be witnesses, the apostles.

Brothers and sisters, let us pray that the Risen Christ continues to accompany His Church on the paths of history. May He remain present in our hearts and minds and continue to teach us and share with us the bread of life. Amen.

"Hearts on fire for the Lord (Luke 24:13–35)"

When I look back and see how life has changed me, it is remarkable to observe just how much God can do with so very little, just like a piece of raw timber in the hands of a carpenter, waiting to be chiselled into something magnificent. Look at the transformation of simple fishermen into disciples of the Lord and preachers to all nations. This is the remarkable result when hearts burn with a fire of faith, hope and love for the Lord. This is what motivated all the followers of Christ and what continues to motivate us to this day.

Over six decades ago, as a frightened and shy little Lebanese girl, an immigrant to Australia, I had to learn a new language and adapt to the rejection and name-calling which became a daily ritual at school. Perhaps this set the foundations for my fighting spirit to survive in the coming years. It certainly gave me a hunger to learn and aspire to achieve more in life. Unfortunately, I became an object for abuse, but this only drew me closer to Jesus, my "invisible friend" to whom I ran for comfort and consolation. Yes, I was too young to know much about faith or reason, but I only needed to know that Jesus was there for me.

From these past experiences I found myself instinctively defending anyone who was being treated unfairly, or helping those in need of assistance. It became clear to me, as I grew in maturity and wisdom, that God had allowed me to carry many crosses so that I may know how to help others in carrying theirs. Jesus was no longer my "invisible friend" – He is my Lord and my God, for whom my heart continues to burn.

Only by the grace of God has my life progressed to this stage. My career path was set on becoming a social worker, but in the hands of Jesus I was to become more, in various fields. The Carpenter and His chisel are still at work in me every day. I was inspired recently by a dear friend, with the words of Edith Stein "A woman's soul is fashioned to be a shelter in which other souls may unfold" (Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross). This gave me great consolation in knowing that the diverse roles in my vocation have led me to be a 'spiritual mother' for many souls, and I pray they have found that God alone is the shelter and refuge they seek. He alone is the guiding Light to which their journey must lead. It has been empowering to know that I may serve Him by 'making disciples' in my own little part of the world. All glory to God!



في عالم اليوم الذي يعزِّز الكبرياء والغرور وينمِّي الفرديَّة بواسطة التسويق والدعايات التي تدعو إلى المظاهر ووسائل التواصل الإجتماعي والموضة التي تدفع إلى الأضواء والشهرة، يدعونا يسوع أكثر من أي وقت للتعلُّم منه الوداعة وتواضع القلب وهو منطق يسير بعكس إتّجاه العالم.

يدعونا يسوع دائماً للتشبّه به وهذه هي دعوة الله للإنسان لإستعادة صورته البهيَّة التي شوَّهتها الخطيئة. وخطيئةِ الكبرياء هي أمّ الخطايا وجذر كلّ شرّ. الكبرياء هو سبب السقوط، هوَ عندما نستبدل مشيئة الله بمشيئتنا ونضع أنفسنا مكان الله ومن الكبرياء تأتي كلّ الخطايا. لقد عاش يسوع التواضع في كلّ ما عمل. علَّم التواضع ودعا إليهِ بإستمرار لأنَّ التواضع هوَ المدخل إلى القداسة والحصْن المَنيع ضدَّ الخطيئة وتجارب الشرّير.

إنّ الله متواضع، ويسوع إبن الله وصورتهِ يعكس لنا هذا التواضع وهو على ما يقول مار بولس "لم يحسب مساواته لله غنيمة بل أخلى ذاته آخذاً صورةَ العبد". فَسِرِّ التجسُّد هو قمَّة تواضعِ الله. يسوع يدعونا للإقتداء به بإخلاء ذاتنا والإمتلاء من الله.

وكما تقول القديسة تيريزا دي كالكوتا "رِذا كنّا مسيحيّين، يجب أن نتَشبَّه بالمسيح، لأنّ قلبَه كان متواضعًا وكان دائم الانتباه إلى حاجات البشر. حيث كانَ يمرّ يسوع، كانَ يزرع الخير الآن وقد علمتم بأنّ الله يحبُّكم، أليس من الطبيعيّ أن تمضوا الفترة المتبقّية

من حياتِكم وأنتم تشعّون بهذا الحبّ؟ أن نكون مسيحيّين حقيقيّين يعني أن نستقبلَ المسيح حقًّا وأن نتحوّلَ إلى مسيح آخر. يعني أن نحبّ كما نحن محبوبون، كما أحبّنا المسيح على الصليب".

قوّة الحب

قيامة المسيح من بين الأموات هي الرجاء الحقيقي للعالم، ذلك الذي لا يخيّب أبدًا. إنها قوّة حبّة القمح، ذلك الحب الذي يتنازل ويبذل نفسه حتى النهاية والذي يجدد العالم بحق. فلم يعد للموت والوحدة والخوف الكلمة الأخيرة. إنّ قوّة الحب تحمل الثمار اليوم في أخاديد تاريخنا، الذي يشوهه الظلم والعنف: إنها تحمل ثمار الرجاء والكرامة حيث يوجد البؤس والاستبعاد، حيث يوجد الجوع والبطالة وبين ضحايا الاتجار القائم من بين الأموات ثمار الحياة الجديدة للعالم أجمع فالاحتفال بعيد الفصح يعني الإيمان مجدّدًا بأن الله يدخل ولا يكفّ عن الدخول في تاريخنا، متحدّيا حتميّتنا الموحِّدَة والمُعيقة. الاحتفال بعيد الفصح يعني أن ندع يسوع يقهر ذاك التصرّف الجبان الذي غالبًا ما يحاصرنا ويحاول أن يدفن كلّ أنواع الرجاء.

في اليوم عينه، كان إثنان من التلاميذ ذاهبين إلى قرية تدعى عمَّاوس، تبعد نحو سبعة أميال عن أورشليم. وكانا يتحدثان بكل تلك الأمور التي حدثت. وفيما هما يتحدثان ويتساءلان، إذا يسوع نفسه قد اقترب منهما، وراح يسير معهما. ولكن أعينهماً أمسكت عن معرفته. أمًا هو فقال لهما : `` ما هذا الكلام الَّذي تتحادثان به وأنتَّما تسيران؟ ″ فوقفا عابسين. وأجاب أحدهما، واسمه كليوباس، فقال له: ``هل أنت وحَّدك غريب عن ورشليم، فَلاَ تعلم ما حِدثُ فيهًا هذه الأيام؟ " فقال لهما: ``وما هي؟ " فقالا له: ``ما يتعلَق بَيسوع النّاصري، الّذي كان رجلاً نبيّاً قويّاً بالقول والفعل، قدّام الله والشعب كلُّه. وكيف أسلمه أحبارنا ورؤساؤنا ليُحكم عُليه بالُموت، وكيف صلبوه! وكنا نحن نرجو أن يكون هو الذي سيفدي إسرائيل. ولكن مع هذا كلُّه، فهذا هو اليوم الثالث بعد تلك الأحداث. لكن بعض النساء من جماعتَّنا أدهشنَّنا، لأنَّهنَّ ذهبِّن إلى القبر عند الفجر، ولم يجدن جسد يسوع، فرجعَن وقلّن إنّهنّ شاهدَن ملائكة تراءوا لهنّ وقالوا إنّه حيّ! ومضى قوم من الذين معنا إلى القبر، فوجدوه هكذا كما قالت النساء، وأما يسوع فلم يروه " . فقال لهما يُسوع: " يا عديمي الفهم، وبطيئ القلب في الإيمان بكل ما تكلُّم به الأنبياء! أما كان يجب على المسيح أن يعاني تلك الآلام، ثمَّ يدخل في مجده؟ وفسّر لهماً ما يتعلّق به في كل الكتب المقدّسة، مبتدئاً بموسى وجميع الأنبياء. واقتربا من القرية التي كانا ذاهبين إليها، فتظاهر يسوع بأنه ذاهب إلى مكان أبعد. فتمسّكا به قائلين: ``أمكث معنا '' فقد حاّن المساء، ومال النهار '' فدخل ليمُكث معهما. وفيما كان متكئاً معهما، أخذ الخبز، وبارك وكسر، وناولهما. فانفتحت أعينهما، وعرفاه، فإذا هو قد توارى عنهما. فقال أحدهما للآخر: " أما كان قلبنا مضطرماً فينا، حين كان يكلّمنا في الطّريق، ويشرح لنا الكتب؟ " وقاما في تلك الساعة عينها، ورجعا إلى ُورشليم، فوجدا الأحد عشر والذينُ معهم مجتمعين، وهم يقولون: ``حقَّا إنَّ الربِّ قام، وتراءى لسمعان! ´`. أما هما فكانا يخبران بما حدث في الطريق، وكيف عرفا يسوع عند كسر الخبز. لو ٢٤ : ١٣ – ٣٥

إنَّك هنا، معلَّه ومعو يسير

نحن في الأحد الثالث من زمن القيامة. لكن ظهور الربّ لتلميذَي عمّاوس، الذي يرويه إنجيل لوقا، جرى في مساء أحد قيامة الربّ يسوع. إنّه ظهور قرباني، بل نستطيع القول انّه قداس يسوع الأوّل بعد عشائه السّرّى. وبه كرّس يوم الأحد يومًا للربّ، تلتقي فيه الجماعة المؤمنة حول المائدة المثلَّثة؛ الكلمة والذبيحة والمناولة.

التلميذان يعودان إلى عمّاوس بلدتهما كئيبَين مصدومَين من حادثة صلب يسوع، إذ سقطت كلّ آمالهم. وهذا سبّب لهما وجعًا نفسيًّا كبيرًا. في هذا الوقت الصعب تراءى لهم يسوع بمنظر إنسان عاديّ غريب يسير معهما في الطريق فلم يعرفاه، كما لم تعرفه مريم المجدلية (يو٢٠؛ ١٤) ولا الرسل عند بحيرة طبريه (يو ٢١؛ ٤). ما يعنى **أنّ يسوع الممجّد أصبح يسوع الإيمان.** لا نراه بأعين الجسد، بل بأعين القلب المستنير بالإيمان.
